From James Henry Lane to R.M. Ainsworth

[page 1] Lawrence Dec. 1, 1855

D[ea]r friend[,]

I am not fully posted as to <u>all</u> the facts connected with the Transaction of which you speak[,] having been absent at Topeka when they occurred[.] My understanding however isthat a Free State man by the name of Dow was cowardly & brutally murdered by a gang of Proslavery men--near Willow Springs--that afterward they engaged in the murder for the purpose of getting up a difficulty in the Territory[,] swore out a peace warrant against a man by the name of Branson[,] a true great gentleman--that the Sheriff went to Branson[']s store late in the night[,] pointed his pistol at Branson[']s head & without showing his warrant compelled him to mount a mule & go with them--that on the road they were met by an equal number of Free State men who peaceably inquired if Branson was in the crowd[.] he[,] Branson[,] answered he was & a prisoner[.] they said to him come out which he did.

It is understood this city is to be demolished without delay & Dr[.] Starr will be pleased to see you & your friend with the "baggage[.]"
