## General Order.

No. 1.

1<sup>st</sup> Hereafter there will be three roll-calls each day, in each Captain's Company, in which every man that is well, and not on detailed service, or actual duty, is required to come into line, and answer to his name. First roll-call, precisely at sun-rise in the morning. The second roll-call, at two o'clock in the afternoon; at which time the Commanders of each company will have their company drilled, at least one hour. Third roll-call will be at sunset.

2<sup>nd</sup> The commanders of each company will have their non-commissioned officers to meet at ten o'clock, A. M., and drill at least one hour.

3<sup>rd</sup> The bugle shall be sounded for each roll-call, at the proper time, and also at ten o'clock, A. M., for the non-commissioned officer's drill; and every man that fails to be in line, in five minutes after the sounding of the bugle, without a reasonable excuse, shall be subject to be put upon extra duty, or otherwise punished, according to the nature of his offence.

4<sup>th</sup> Commanders of each Company will see that their men commit no depredation, or trespass, upon persons, or private property; and they will be held to a strict accountability for the acts of their men.

5<sup>th</sup> no soldier will be allowed to be absent from his company more than one hour at a time without permission from his Captain. no man will be allowed to go outside of the guards without a written pass unless the officer of the guard shall pass him through
