His Excellency R.M. Stewart, Dear Sir,

I have just learned from my friend Col[.] Mitchell that you regard it as <u>possible</u> that one of the Volunteer Regiments may be taken from this state, and that you have tendered to him the Command. I should be glad to [secure?] the next in command, to wit, that of Lieut Col. provided you are uncommitted to any other person. You know me well, and, I believe, have confidence enough in me to rely on my preserving the honor of the State untarnished, if I should receive the appointment. I have sufficient confidence in my own nerve not to <u>run from an Enemy</u>.

I shall be pleased to hear from you at your leisure.
