Dear PaPa[,]

We were very glad to get your letter, for we all felt very sad to hear such bad news about Charles[,] but now we hope he is not a prisoner, but is safe[,] & we all hope we shall see him again. it seems a long time since he was here with us. I go to school every day now & Ma thinks I learn some. I get a ticket most every night, & when [I] get a few more[,] I shall take them back & get a large coulored one.

Ma bought one bushel of apples & gave 1.50 for them, & Emma & I have one most every day to take for dinner. I like to ride down & back[,] but some times I walk part of the way home & then I get very tired. We have some nuts to crack evenings & we like them very much. Ma is making me a long sleved delain dress to wear to school & I think it will be warm & good. We all want to see you very much & hope you will come home when you can.

the rabbits will crawl through the little plases [places] & eat the trees most every night[,] but the white ones they will not touch.

It is getting late & Ma is very sleepy & tired[,] so you must take a kiss for Ma & some for your little daughter[.]
